How to Apply

Visit our website, www.imls.gov. Explore program descriptions, sample applications, and resources to help you develop a competitive application to the program that best fits your project.

Read the guidelines. Guidelines (or Notices of Funding Opportunities) become available on our website 60 to 90 days before the program deadlines. Read them carefully, and be sure to check the eligibility and cost share requirements.

Check your registrations. Make sure you have a Dun & Bradstreet D-U-N-S® Number; a current and active System for Award Management (SAM.gov) registration, and an up-to-date registration with Grants.gov.

Connect with us. Pre-application webinars help you learn more about programs and application how-to's. Conversations with Office of Museum Services program staff can help you to explore how your idea may match the goals of a grant program.
