Travel. Travel, including lodging and airfare, has been arranged by Oicenth Josephs (ojosephs@FLMNH.ufl.edu), iDigBio's project assistant. Everyone should know their flight details and hotel assignment. We are using two hotels in Ann Arbor, the Michigan League (also the venue of the workshop) and the Bell Tower Hotel, a short walk away. Adobe Connect. The workshop will be broadcast via Adobe Connect at https://idigbio.adobeconnect.com/invertimaging. Adobe Connect requires no special software outside of a browser. Attendees can follow along via their laptops. Please let your colleagues know about this opportunity. There are no restrictions to logging in and monitoring the workshop, and a chat box will be available for remote attendees to ask questions or make comments. A few of our presentations will be from remote attendees who will be using Adobe Connect.

Laptop. Please bring your laptop. Wireless connectivity will be available and virtually all materials will be accessible only through the wiki.

Collaborative Notes. We will provide two collaborative notes documents accessible through the wiki, one for each day. These documents allow all participants to take notes and make comments, all for the community good. Collaborative notes documents remain available on the wiki as archives and have become a popular part of iDigBio's workshops.
