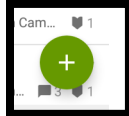
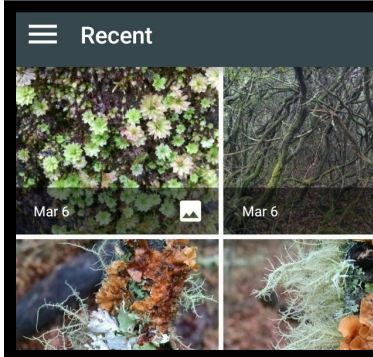


Quick Guide to the iNaturalist Android App

1  Open the app and login or create an account.

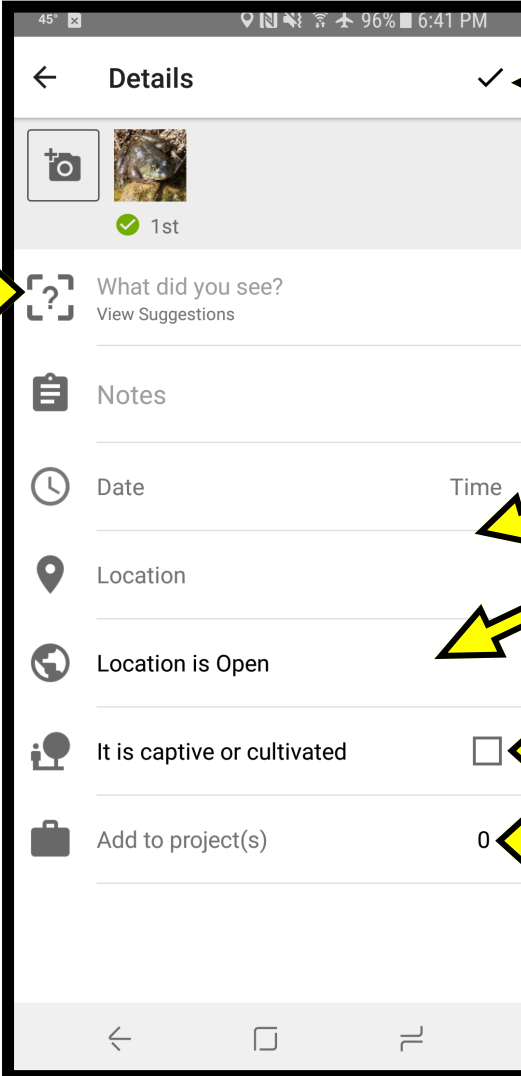
2 Optional: Join Natural North Carolina or other projects you want to contribute toward. Click the three lines in the upper left and choose projects to search!

3 Tap the + sign 

4 Take or choose a photo. 

5 Enter observation details and tap “Save”

iNaturalist has image recognition! Tap on “What did you see?” and the app will suggest species if you are online. If nothing looks right, type in what you know about the species and click search, or browse. Click “Add” when you’ve gotten as close as you can, but try not to guess—leave this blank if you just don’t know!



6 Tap the checkmark when you are ready to submit! It should submit automatically, but tap the Sync button if it appears.

Date and location will autofill if you have your location services enabled. Otherwise, click to edit your location.

Don't want everyone to see where you made your observation? Choose obscured or private to publicly obscure or hide your observation.

Did this species get here on its own? If not, check this box.

Choose projects to share your observation with here. You will need to add projects before you can select them here. Choose Natural North Carolina and any other projects you like!

Note: Images here depict the Android version of the iNaturalist app. The iPhone version is similar, but looks a little different.

Quick Guide to the iNaturalist Website

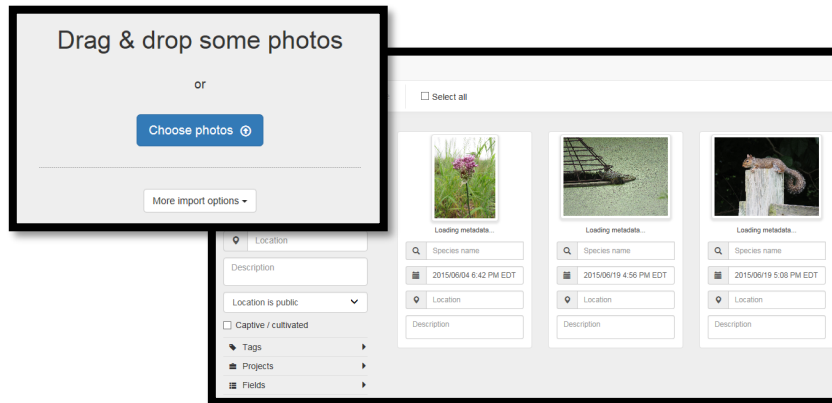
1 Go to inaturalist.org and create an account. Login to your account.

2 Click “Projects.”
Optional: search for Natural North Carolina and tap “Join.” Repeat for others!

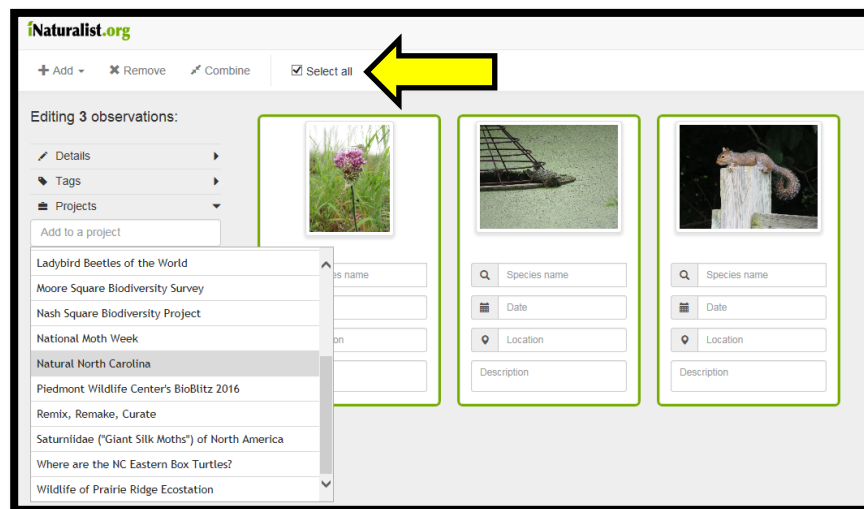
3 Click the + Observations button in the upper right of the screen.



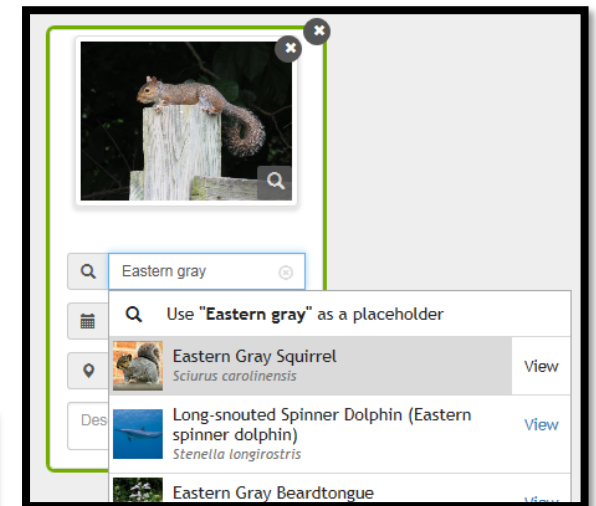
4 Select photos and drag and drop them into the window.



5 Your date and time will be added automatically. To add the same location, project, etc, to all photos, check the “Select all” box and add the appropriate fields.



6 Add your ID to each photo. Choose the species (or other taxon) from the list that appears when you start typing. Note: it’s best to ID your species ONLY as far as you’re sure!



7 Make sure every photo has at least a date, location, and projects listed, then click “Submit” in the upper right corner!
