



Monday 29

- Saw an immense flock of <u>snow buntings</u> flying; they feed at this season (as do also snow birds tree sparrows and gold finches) on the seeds of certain tall bank weeds.
- Wednesday, January 31, 1866
- I heard plainly a flock of cherry birds, which are the first. I do not think that the <u>blue jays</u> are around now for I have been to all their haunts without seeing any.
- Thursday, February 1
- A mottled owl was seen today; seen again on the 4th; shot on the 5th
