- iDigBio is trying to gauge the interest level in participating in field trips while in Gainesville.
  - Potential Data Carpentry workshop before the Summit; potential field trips after the Summit
  - Additional costs outside of normal travel dates -----would be at participant's own expense
  - Goal is to make the overall Summit more valuable for everyone
  - Overall consensus is that it is too far in advance for attendees to commit
- Attendees - How many? What composition?
- TCN vs. PEN vs. No cost extensions
  - Some TCNs have a large number of PIs (and not all can attend)
  - PENs are the mechanism to encourage sustainability --> we should reward this behavior
- The goal of the Summit needs to be defined. Should the focus solely be digitization mobilization forum to learn from each other? Or is more training with new TCN members most important?
- House vs. Senate --> equal representation vs. representation based on size
- People should take advantage of remote access
- Bruce Lieberman's recommendation: I would recommend 2 individuals allowed per current and no cost extension TCN's. They can determine if the 2nd person would be from a PEN or a partner, at their discretion. Then 1 person can be invited for each retired TCN. After that # is determined, if there are funds to support travel still remaining, those could go to invite more people from the larger TCNs.
